Iris House Changing Lives!

everly is a transgendered MTF (male to female) Client who was born in Honduras and migrated to the United States seeking asylum in June 2022. Upon her arrival to the U.S., she was placed in a detention center for immigrants in California and was then transferred to Corona, Queens.

In October 2022, Beverly contacted Iris House who met with her and identified housing as a primary need. We then provided Beverly with guidance on submitting an application with the NYC Human Resources Administration/HIV/AIDS Service Administration Supportive Housing Program. Beverly successfully submitted a supportive housing application and upon receipt, Beverly was called into the housing office to complete an intake and interview. She was accepted into the housing

program on October 5th and moved into her own fully furnished apartment on October 20, 2022. From intake to move in, the process only took two weeks! To accommodate her language (Spanish speaking), Beverly was paired with a bilingual Case Manager at Iris House, ensuring that all her needed services were in place, including medical, pharmacy, mental health, and legal immigration services. Beverly shared that she is in the process of transitioning; she receives hormone therapy and recently underwent facial feminization surgery. The Iris House Housing team collaborates with our Food and Nutrition Services team to ensure that Beverly receives food/pantry deliveries while she is recovering at home. The Housing team remains excited for Beverly in her transition and in her journey to becoming a permanent U.S. resident!



Message from Former IRIS HOUSE Board Members

his past year, Iris House celebrated its 30th anniversary of serving women affected by the HIV epidemic. The elegant event, hosted by the Iris House Executive Director and Board of Advisors, celebrated the community leaders who have been at the forefront of addressing HIV in communities of color and in women specifically. The event, which included Iris House staff members, leaders, clients, donors and supporters, and former members of the Board of Directors, demonstrated the stability of this organization in an environment where HIV/AIDS organizations come and go. Through the years of financial and political upheaval, Iris House has very clearly maintained its connectedness and grounding in the community which is, of course, the source of its strength.

The concept of Iris House was initiated in 1993 at a meeting of women in then Manhattan Borough President Ruth Messinger's office. It was led by women consumers, community leaders, and healthcare professionals, and supported by the NYC government and healthcare institutions. The discussions addressed the growing understanding that HIV disproportionately impacted women of color. These same women lived in communities without access to basic health services, supportive housing, and food. From these discussions, Iris House was born to address these urgent needs. Iris House was named in honor of Iris de La Cruz, a warrior HIV activist and educator living with AIDS who founded Life Force to educate women and the first women's HIV support group.

From the beginning, Iris House has addressed the changing needs of those affected by HIV in a supportive, inclusive environment. What began as provision of supportive services for women with HIV adapted as the needs of the community shifted. Today, Iris House provides HIV testing, counseling,

education, prevention services, and linkage to care for women and their affected families. Supporting these families and communities directly improves lives.

Walking into Iris House today, one would find the same welcoming



environment staffed by professionals who are attuned to the community's needs. Undoubtedly, one will notice that we now wrap this community-based organization in a sophisticated system with access to sustainable services. Iris House plays a national role in HIV and health access advocacy, meeting community needs over a much larger footprint with a far reach.

How did Iris House morph from a small, scrappy but essential idea into the sophisticated service and advocacy organization that it is today? Simply, leadership matters. Ingrid Floyd and the Iris House Board of Advisors have understood how to thread the needle and create an organization that is both responsive to and grounded in the local, regional, and national women's community while establishing the business management practices needed to ensure organization viability. As times have changed, Iris House has risen to adapt to these changes. By doing so, it remains one of the few organizations that has thrived throughout the HIV epidemic and is a leader in the field.



PrEP Aware Week 2023



ris House organized more than 10 PrEP Aware Week (PAW) events in October 2023, reaching approximately 500 individuals citywide. For example, we hosted one of our PAW events at 4West Lounge, one of the premier LGBTQ+ lounges in Harlem. Troy Weekes, Iris House's 2023 Ambassador addressed the audience on the importance of PrEP among gay men in Harlem and the services offered by Iris House, and Iris House staff provided HIV, HCV, and syphilis rapid testing and referrals to PrEP. Jomil Luna, Pharmacy Representative at the AIDS Healthcare Foundation (AHF) spoke about AHF's pharmacy program and seamless referral process to PrEP. Guests were delighted by the signature PrEP cocktail and delicious hors d'oeurves.

In addition, Iris House held an event at the AHF Wellness Center in the Bronx, conducted a workshop on PrEP and women during an emotional wellness group, and partnered with Parkchester Baptist Church, Wyckoff Medical Center, First Corinthian Baptist Church,

Jacobi Medical Center, Exponents, and the Mexican Consulate who also conducted a PAW educational program at their respective sites. Attendees received a PAW t-shirt, educational information, and the opportunity to enroll in PrEP.
