- Genetics
- Epigenetics

Genetics


30-70% of Weight is Genetic

- -Twin studies
- -Pima Indians
- –Prisoner studies



Epigenetics, too!

The study of heritable changes caused by the activation and deactivation of genes without any change in DNA sequence.



You are what your mother ate.



Supplementing pregnant mice (from a genetically obese strain) with a cocktail of anti-oxidants prevents obesity and diabetes in their offspring.

You are what you eat?



You *are* what you eat! The types of food you eat can cause epigenetic changes!

- FUNGENUT: rye versus wheat-oat-potato diet
 - Rye: down-regulated genes for insulin signaling.
 - Oat-wheat-pasta: up-regulated genes for inflammation.
- Bisphenol A
 - People with the highest levels of Bisphenol A in their urine had a 39% increased risk for the development of metabolic syndrome and heart disease.

Changes persist through two generations, if not more.


You are how much you exercised as a child.


DIO pups become obese on a high-fat diet, but:






- Even only 3 weeks of exercise can prevent obesity
- Calorie restricting the pups backfires
- Doesn't work for adults








We are how much our brain wants us to weigh. • Dopamine D2 receptors are decreased in the obese, as in those suffering from addiction to drugs. • brain circuits (reward, motivation, learning, inhibitory control) are disrupted in overeating behavior. • R Brain Hypothesis


