


Diagnoses of HIV Infection and Population among Adult and Adolescent Females, by Race/Ethnicity 2013—United States **Female Population**

$$N=9,278$$



If you decide to take PrEP...

- Go to clinic
 - For medical screening, HIV and pregnancy tests & medication refills every 3 months
 - Testing for STIs and kidney function every 6 months
- Pick up medications every month

In June 2014, Governor Andrew Cuomo announced a 3-point plan to end the AIDS epidemic in NYS by the year 2020.





What does it mean to "End the AIDS Epidemic?

The end of the AIDS epidemic in New York will occur when the total number of new HIV infections has fallen below the number of HIV-related deaths.

The goal is to reduce the number of new HIV infections to just **750** by 2020

3 POINTS

Identify HIV + undiagnosed

Identify persons with HIV who remain undiagnosed and link them to health care

Link, retain, support viral suppression

Link and retain persons diagnosed with HIV to health care and start them on anti-HIV therapy to maximize HIV virus suppression to remain healthy and prevent further transmission

Black and Brown Women: PrEP is for us, too We need to advocate to make PrEP even more available and accessible for women


